ASES Re-Cap:

- Applied for funding in early November 2006
- Five Schools Awarded in January 2007
 - Garfield
 - Jefferson
 - McKinley
 - Washington
 - Wilson
- Implementation on February 5, 2007

Importance of a February 5th Implementation

- Able to service students on 2/5/07?
 - If so, the State will give the District a full year's worth of funding for the last 5 months of the school year
 - If not, this year's allocation would be reduced for each day the program was not able to serve students
- We met this timeline and received the full allotment for the 2007/08 school year
 - \$112,500 per site (\$7.50 per student per day)
- LEAs were expected to collaborate with agencies, parents, etc. after implementation
 - This is the opposite of the Healthy Start model

Partners

- Each school chose a lead agency to work with:
 - City of San Leandro Recreation Department
 - Garfield, Jefferson, Washington and Wilson
 - San Leandro Boys and Girls Club
 - McKinley



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ASES FAQ:

- *What does ASES stand for?*
 - After School Education Safety

- *What are the hours? How many days/hours must we operate?*
 - Beginning immediately after the end of school until at least 6:00pm (3-4 hours each day)
 - Minimum of 15 hours per week
 - Every regular school day during the school year

- *What must the program include?*
 - Daily nutritious snack
 - Two elements:
 - educational literacy
 - educational enrichment



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ASES FAQ:

- *What do you mean by literacy?*
 - Must include tutoring and/or homework assistance
 - Examples include:
 - Remedial activities
 - Extended learning activities in core content areas
 - Programs that emphasize language skills
 - Achievement for English Learners
 - Technology education
 - Expanded library hours
 - Programs for truant or suspended students



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ASES FAQ:

- *What do you mean by enrichment?*
 - Examples include:
 - Fine arts activities
 - Recreational activities
 - Science related activities (rocketry, robotics)
 - Physical fitness activities
 - Career-technical education
 - Prevention activities
 - Service learning
 - Mentoring
 - School health
 - Character education

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Options for Additional Enrichment

- Spanish for non-Spanish Speakers
 - Viva el Espanol
 - Beginner/exposure course offered two days per week for 50 minutes
 - Advanced session for those wanting language acquisition, offered four days per week for 50 minutes

Options for Additional Enrichment

- Pallen's Martial Arts
 - Character Kicks Program
 - Six week program for 30 students
 - 1 day per week for one hour
 - Can Serve two schools at a time
 - Self Defense
 - Self Discipline and respect
 - Bully Busters: strategies to deal with conflict (walk away with confidence)
 - Goal Setting

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Middle School ASES

- Currently in the 2nd year of a 3-year grant cycle
- Current model: using District employed staff to run programs
 - Used mainly as an intervention program for students performing below or far below basic on State exams
 - 1-3 teachers involved at each site with instructional aides coordinating most of the program
- This grant has been rolled over, and the same rules now apply to our Middle School after school programs and to our elementary school programs.
 - Middle schools need 100 students enrolled



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Middle School ASES

- The Program in 2007/08
 - Partnering with the City's Recreation Department to strengthen the after school offerings for 07/08
 - Approaching site teachers to get involved as academic liaisons, intervention teachers, tutors, etc.
 - Seeking out other vendors for additional enrichment choices more appropriate to middle school age students (i.e. robotics, martial arts, computer driven activities, etc.)



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Childcare Update

- Washington Elementary
 - Full Day Childcare offered in Room #8
 - Partnership between the District, City and Davis St.
 - Davis St. staff to work from 8:00am to 11:30am
 - ASES to begin at 11:30am and work through 6:00pm
 - Solution offers care for both am and pm kindergarten students, as well as early and late readers (gr. 1-3).
 - Timeline:
 - DSFRC has attended 1 of 2 meetings to secure licensing for Room #8
 - 2nd meeting will be on 6/21/07 (application is turned in and walkthrough scheduled)
 - State Agency will perform a licensing walkthrough for Room #8

Childcare Update

- Jefferson Elementary
 - Current Facility houses subsidized childcare
 - Some families have expressed a want for unsubsidized (full pay) care.
 - It is possible to sub-divide the current facility into two separate, fully staffed and licensed spaces.
 - DSFRC requires approximately 25 children enrolled full time to recover their costs.
 - We are working on a plan to present the idea to the community to see how many are interested in this type of program.
