MEASURE **J1** BOND UPDATE

Project planning underway

Thanks to our voters who approved **MEASURE J1** in November, the **SAN LEANDRO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT WILL RECEIVE \$104,000,000 IN FUNDING** for critical facility upgrades and learning tools for our students. We have kicked off the planning stage of our bond projects and we are forming a Citizens Bond Oversight Committee -- made up of community volunteers -- responsible for overseeing the bond expenditures and communicating progress to the public.

PHASE ONE of the multi-year **J1 BOND** project includes installing heating, ventilation, and air conditioning units in classrooms, upgrading technology for our students and staff, and completing select library renovations.




CAASPP TEST RESULTS

Improvements in key areas

SLUSD's most recent state testing results show marked improvement and underscore our dedication to student achievement and growth. Specifically, 75 percent of our elementary and secondary schools demonstrated positive growth for English Language Arts (ELA), and half of the elementary schools demonstrated double-digit growth in ELA over last year. Similarly, in mathematics, 75 percent of elementary and secondary schools showed year over year improvement. We are committed to seeing even more marked progress in the future.





TWO WAY BILINGUAL IMMERSION PROGRAM

Bilingual from the beginning

A new research-based program at Washington Elementary brings native English-speaking and native Spanish-speaking students together. **THE TWO WAY BILINGUAL IMMERSION PROGRAM (TWBI)** will allow entering kindergarteners to utilize their strong foundation in one language to master the second language. As a result, students reach the goals of becoming bilingual and biliterate in Spanish and English while meeting common core state standards and gaining high levels of multicultural proficiency.


SECONDARY PROGRAM REDESIGN

New courses, new schedules and new opportunities

Over the next two years, **THE FOLLOWING CHANGES WILL BE IMPLEMENTED** for grades 6-12 in SLUSD:

- Conversion to block schedule allowing select longer class periods for deeper engagement and project-based work.
- Advisory period for the middle schools building relationships with advisory teachers to encourage positive socio-emotional development.
- Career pathways at SLHS providing career exposure and planning through sequences of college and career readiness courses in five disciplines.
- Career exposure for middle school students bringing career experiences inside and outside of the classroom.
- **9th grade career and college readiness course** requiring all 9th grade students to start exploring and planning for their future.
- Fred T. Korematsu (FTK) campus changes 9th graders will no longer be located solely at the FTK campus but instead integrated across both campuses in order to take advantage of all high school programming available to them.
